<u>Dubrovnik</u> is a city in the southern Croatia, by the Adriatic Sea. It is one of the <u>UNESCO</u> World Heritage Sites

in recognition of its outstanding medieval architecture and fortified old town and one of the most prominent tourist destinations in the Mediterranean. In its long >1000 year old history, especially during the time period when it ruled itself as a free state Dubrovnik became known for its maritime trade and skilled diplomacy.

The population of the city is about 40.000 people.
